



Throughout the summer of 2010, Urban Building Projects were contracted to convert an unused fire engine depot into a modern boxing facility for youngsters in the Warrington area called Phoenix Fire.

The scheme (funded by Cheshire Fire Service and managed by David Trowler & Associates) involved the creation of a training facility to house two Olympic sized boxing rings, training areas and sparring zones with specialised non slip flooring. A new mezzanine area was also constructed to provide a gymnasium for the fire service and full male and female changing and shower facilities were constructed on the ground floor.

Urban improved on the contract period of twelve weeks by completing in ten. In addition Urban redeveloped part of the station into a new breathing apparatus room and provided feature lighting within the walls and new external parking.

At the official hand over ceremony, Urban also donated a new plasma television screen to the facility.

Commenting on the project, Andy Selly, Senior Facilities Officer at the station, said, "Everyone involved on the project from the station staff to the boxing club members cannot say enough about how well Urban performed on this project."
